The husband has to carry his wife on his back over a short course in order to win a "piggy" keg of beer. A few simple rules will apply: The wife to be carried may be your own, the neighbour's or a friend's. In fact, the couple need not even be married. The contestants race two pairs at a time, the only prop allowed is a man's belt, and there is a 10-second penalty if the wife is dropped. There are four customary styles to carry your wife, the traditional piggy-back, the thrown over the shoulders, or cross-wise on the carrier's shoulders or the famous "Estonian Carry" where the husband grabs the wife's thighs and dangles her upside down on his back.

New this year for advanced couples will be a Wheelbarrow Wife Carrying obstacle race!
